Individual Device Policy

Solebury School uses instructional technology as one way of enhancing our mission to teach the skills, knowledge, and behaviors students will need as responsible citizens in the global community. To that end, all students are required to have access to appropriate technology for use in classes, the brand and specifications of which are up to the student and student's family and may be influenced by the technical requirements and recommendations below. Solebury School recognizes that individual students will differ as to their preferences for devices and how they study, write, and create. While useful tools in their own right, cell phones are not acceptable devices in terms of meeting the productivity needs in Solebury classes.

Teachers and courses will differ, but in-class activities that are commonly required by teachers include writing, Internet research, watching videos, accessing eBooks, downloading materials, and other web-based tasks. While the majority of classes do not require the installation of specialized software, students generally will need a way of writing papers, using spreadsheets, and making presentations. All students are also able to access and install licensed versions of many of the Adobe suite of programs. Solebury School's wireless network is available inside all classroom buildings, athletic center, dorms, dining areas, library, and many outside areas.

Minimum Technical Requirements

- ***Current and up-to-date anti-virus software installed and running***
- Please be advised that classes which require the installation of software will require technology that meets the specifications specified above. Examples of this include Photography and Digital Design classes
- Webcam
- Microphone (A headset may be a good option for audio needs)
- Compatible with the Google Suite: Chrome, Drive, Docs, etc. either via a browser or apps
- Able to connect to a wireless network
- A healthy battery that can last through the school day
- A physical keyboard, either built-in or connected via Bluetooth
- As a Google School, the bulk of student work is expected to be done with the Google suite noted above, however having productivity suites such as MS Office or Mac's productivity apps on student devices is perfectly fine

- Optional, but strongly recommended
 - An extended warranty for your device
 - A protective case. If planning to use a tablet make sure it protects the corners.
 - Activation of the device locator, such as Find my Mac, Find my Device to more readily locate a missing device.
